

**ACUTE MYOCARDIAL INFARCTION
STANDARD OF CARE**

Core Measure Quality Indicator checklist

Admission Section

- Chest pain/AMI protocol initiated via admission order set

- Aspirin at arrival (given within 24 hours before or after arrival to hospital) or
 - Contraindication documented

- LVEF (Left Ventricular Ejection Fraction) assessment documented. LVEF (left ventricular ejection fraction) of less than 40% indicates LVSD (Left ventricular systolic dysfunction). EF can be found in results of echo, cardiac cath, H&P, physician progress notes, etc.)

- Smoking cessation/counseling addressed if patient has smoked anytime in past 12 months

Discharge Section

- Beta Blocker at discharge Or
 - Contraindication documented

- Aspirin at discharge Or
 - Contraindication documented

- ACE-I (Ace inhibitor) and/or ARB (Angiotensin receptor blocker) at discharge for LVSD, EF (ejection fraction) of < 40%
LVSD = left ventricular systolic dysfunction

If patient is not on an ACE-I and/or ARB at discharge, documentation must address each drug individually.

- ACE-I ordered at discharge or contraindication documented

- ARB ordered at discharge or contraindication documented
